What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We provide discretionary and non-discretionary investment management services on a wrap fee basis as well as financial planning services to individuals, trusts and estates (our "retail investors").

When a retail investor engages us to provide investment management services we shall monitor, on a continuous basis, the investments in the accounts over which we have authority as part of our investment management service. Furthermore, when engaged on a discretionary basis, we shall have the authority, without prior consultation with you (unless you impose restrictions on our discretionary authority), to buy, sell, trade and allocate the investments within your account(s) consistent with your investment objectives. Our authority over your account(s) shall continue until our engagement is terminated.

Our standard wrap fee engagement includes investment management and financial planning services. We generally require a minimum asset level of \$1,000,000 to open and maintain an advisory account.

You should be aware that participating in a wrap fee program may cost more or less than the cost of purchasing advisory, brokerage and custodial services separately or from other advisers. Furthermore, as we are responsible for transactions fees associated with trades made within your account, we have a disincentive to purchase or sell securities in your account which may result in transaction expenses and therefore creates a conflict of interest.

We also provide financial planning and consulting services on a separate stand-alone basis.

When we provide financial planning or consultation services, we rely upon the information provided by the client for our financial analysis and do not verify any such information while providing this service.

We do not limit the scope of our investment advisor services to proprietary products or a limited group or type of investment.

What Fees will I pay?

We provide our investment advisory services on a fee basis. When engaged to provide investment management services, we shall charge a fee calculated as a percentage of your assets under our management (our "AUM Fee"). Our annual AUM Fee is negotiable but does not exceed 2.00%.

We typically deduct our AUM Fee from one or more of your accounts, in advance, on a quarterly basis. Because our AUM Fee is calculated as a percentage of your assets under management, the more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us for our investment management services. Therefore, we have an incentive to encourage you to increase the assets maintained in accounts we manage.

We offer our Financial Planning services on either a fixed fee basis, generally between \$1,000 and \$5,000, or on an hourly rate basis, generally between \$100 to \$300 per hour. The fee for subsequent work shall be agreed to prior to commencing the engagement.

<u>Other Fees and Costs</u>: Your investment assets will be held with a qualified custodian. Custodians generally charge brokerage commissions and/or transaction fees for effecting certain securities transactions. To the extent you have engaged us on a wrap fee basis you will not incur these fees in addition to our AUM Fee. However, relative to all mutual fund and exchange traded fund purchases, certain charges will be imposed at the fund level

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. As an example, a number of our financial professionals are also registered representatives of APW Capital, Inc. ("APW"), an SEC registered broker-dealer. Therefore, your financial professional may offer you brokerage services through APW or investment advisory services through us. Brokerage services and investment advisory services are different, and the fees we, and APW, charge for those services are different. It is important that you understand the differences. Your financial professional may earn transaction-based compensation and have additional conflicts of interest as a result of providing brokerage services through APW. Our financial professionals generally only recommend investment advisory services to our clients and generally use APW Capital, Inc. for, smaller accounts, in-kind transfers from new clients, and/or legacy business.
